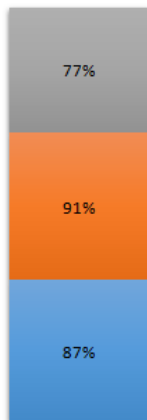
AMK client households generate income through farm activities, non-farm activities, and other sources of in-flows.

Farm activities refer to the activities dealing with crops, livestock, and Common Property Resources (CPR). Non-farm activities include income from casual labor, salaried labor, manufacturing, and services. Other sources of inflows include remittances (domestic and international), sales, rental, and income from loans.

Nearly all rural households in Cambodia undertake at least one farm activity. 95% undertake at least one non-farm activity (see graph 1 below) and 55% also benefit from other inflow sources (excluding receiving loans).

Graph 1: Main Cash Inflow Sources (% of households that list as source of income)

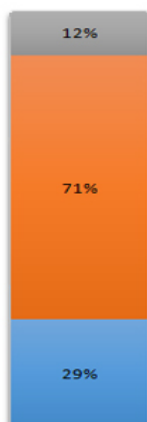
■ Farm ■ Non-Farm ■ Other



Graph 1 shows that non-farm activity is the major income earning source, accounting for 91% within rural households. This is followed by 87% for farm activities and 77% from other inflow activities.

Graph 2 provides information on the single activity that contributed the highest percentage of cash inflow to the household. 71% of the households ranked non-farm activities as the number one cash earner in the household and 29% of the households for farm activities. Only 12% of the households cited other inflows as the primary main source of income to their households.
